
VIRGO

Solar power to the people

TIME & ENERGY FIRST APPEARED AS a column in the *Braidwood Times* on June 7 2007. Most of weekly columns that followed lamented the slow pace of energy reform in this country. Well here we are at the end of 2012 and still nothing much is happening.

Time & Energy originally started in 1978 as a magazine produced by a motley collective of people involved in the anti-uranium movement. It trawled the daily papers for news about atomic energy, fossil fuels and the emerging renewable technologies. Actually, not much has changed since those days either.

The oil and coal lobbies are still welcomed into the corridors of power while alternative energy promoters cry out to be heard. If it takes another 35 years to see positive support for renewables from our politicians, all our geese will be cooked, flooded, or blown away in wild storms.

What we're seeing now is an endless forest of green papers, white papers, discussion papers, position papers - until it's enough to give you the need of perforated paper.

I know I've said this before, but it is worth reiterating, that it all boils down to the need to burn less coal in the making of electricity. Every other fuel source is better. It stands to reason then, that we could measure our progress by celebrating every tonne of coal that is not mined, exported or burned.

Why are we not? The scientists are nearly all agreed - and that's a rare enough event - that the burning of fossil fuels is directly responsible for global warming and the resulting climate change.

The renewable energy industry is vibrant, inventive, job creating and completely credible in its claim that all it needs is a level playing field. There is nothing 'counter-culture' or 'hippy' about renewables. Check out any of the many trade magazines. The biggest global names in industrial production are in there refining the latest technologies.

It is only in the corridors of power that

the message is muffled by vested interest and political ineptitude. The voices that spruik the idea that coal power and accelerating growth are mandatory requirements for progress are the same ones that have brought the industrialised world to the brink of financial ruin.

So what to do about it?

The good news is that delaying renewable energy uptake, especially solar, is bound to fail eventually. The power of the sun is distributed by latitude, not by social status or inherited wealth. If the collection technology continues to get cheaper, as it is, the move to solar is inevitable.

Palerang is in one of the best zones on the planet for harvesting solar energy. Short of making solar power illegal, there is nothing any government can

do to stop us making our electricity from the power of the sun.

Sure, they can make it difficult. A most ridiculous situation exists at the moment with metering. Panels on a roof can be wired in 'after the meter' so that the user is saving the full retail price by using the panels' output before buying from the grid.

That's good, that's fair. The consumer has used their own capital to reduce demand on the grid and is paid for it. So why then, if a group of consumers get together and put their panels in a field, in agreement with a local landowner, will they then be paid only the vastly less wholesale price?

If that all sounds like a mind boggle think of it like this. Here in Braidwood we have many people who could afford to invest, say \$1000, in solar energy if it saved them \$300 every year at today's prices - quite likely much more over the 25-year life of the panels.

If the government and the energy utilities will provide a power bill credit when the panels are on the householder's roof, surely it's crazy, or even criminal, not to allow the same benefit if the panels were to be clustered somewhere out of the way on a north facing hill.

We have to lobby our members of parliament for common sense to prevail. Solar energy, along with larger-scale wind power, can become the energy source of choice on cost price alone.

On the dark side though, coal-fired electricity, if not phased out, may end up costing the earth.
